



Interested in the prestigious NVRN exam?

Want to be recognised as one of the premier stroke nurses in Australia?

Here is some further information for you:

The Neurovascular Registered Nurse (NVRN) board certification exam is a prestigious international qualification for stroke nurses to obtain.

ASNEN are proud to partner with the Association of Neurovascular Clinicians (ANVC) to bring this exam to Australia. The exam will be held in conjunction with a rapid review course as a pre- conference workshop at this year's SSA 2021 in Perth, Tuesday 12th October 2021.

The rapid review course will review key stroke management and key stroke evidence-based principles over approx. 4 hours in the morning prior the 180-question multiple choice exam in the afternoon. Please note though, that the course is not a primary teaching course, it is designed to refresh your knowledge around the key principles in stroke care, in preparation for the exam.

While the NVRN exam is highly complementary to the NET SMART Junior stroke education program, run by Prof Anne Alexandrov, NET SMART is NOT a mandatory requirement for sitting the NVRN exam. Any stroke nurse can register for the course/exam. However, please be aware that this exam is designed for nurses who are actively engaged in acute stroke management. It is expected that nurses registering for the exam will have undertaken some degree of study/education in this area - either by undertaking NET SMART Junior (or equivalent course), studying the ANVC Core Curriculum text (available for purchase on the ANVC website) or have undertaken self-education of a reasonably high standard.
